John is a highly experienced Trainer and Assessor for the NVQ in Performing Manufacturing Operations, tracking, monitoring and advising candidates to ensure they reach the required standards. INDUSTRY BACKGROUND

John's extensive grounding in industry began in 1968 with a 20 year stint at Aveling Barford. Having begun as an apprentice, he worked for several years as a bench fitter, and then in 1975 moved on to quality control inspection, working in goods inwards inspection, build assembly shop inspection, machine shop inspection and gauge metrology and gauge setting, reporting to the directors on a daily basis.

When Aveling Barford closed in 1988, John became Assembly Line Supervisor at Autocraft Industries, combining day to day management and problem solving with the organisation and delivery of staff training and Quality Control. John also introduced and implemented a Lean Manufacturing programme. From 1997 to 2006, John also took on the position of Training Officer at Autocraft. This wide-ranging role included:

- Motivating staff to achieve maximum quality & performance.
- Day to day shop training internal and external.
- Training on Disciplinary and motivational courses.
- Computer training of staff, mainly office 2000 and new systems management database.
- Setting up of training courses, with course notes and presentations. Production of training booklets, course handouts etc.
- One to one engine assembly training.
- Full induction for new starters in Health & Safety (2 Days).
- Training staff on Lean Manufacturing simulation.

In 2006, John took up the post of Lecturer and Tutor in Mechanical Engineering at Grantham College where he would spend the next three years designing and delivering engineering training courses, both at the College and on site within local engineering businesses, to learners whose ages ran from 14 to 60 years. Besides training and motivating his students, John was also responsible for tracking their progress, ensuring compliance with City and Guilds, BTEC and Edexcel standards, and for assessing the NVQ in Performing Manufacturing Operations.
